#### CLASS OF 1975 SENIOR TRIP DESTINATION REVISITED

It was a step back in time for members of the I.H.S. Class of '75 who embarked on a nostalgic trip this past August. Linda Benes, Paula (Mathews) Jagelewski, Nancy (Johnson) McCormick, Kris (Skwarski) Heinrich, Rhonee (Trakas) Iula, Margaret (Grande) Bierman, and Grace Szubski - along with three classmates' spouses - traveled by charter bus to Fallingwater in Bear Run, Pennsylvania. The trip brought back memories of their Senior Class Trip to Fallingwater in May 1975.

The trip began with a stop at the Flight 93 Memorial in Shanksville, PA. Visitors relived the tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001, including the crash of Flight 93 which occurred when the passengers stormed the cockpit to thwart hijackers from redirecting the plane to Washington, D.C. They strolled the Memorial Plaza, a serene walkway which followed the flight path, and viewed the 17-ton boulder marking the impact site. At the Visitor Center, they studied a



timeline of activities aboard the plane that coincided with events at the Pentagon in Washington D.C. and the Twin Towers in New York City. They passed the Tower of Voices. a 93-ft. concrete and steel

structure from which 40 wind chimes are suspended, one for each of the 40 Americans aboard Flight 93 who perished that day.

"It really was a somber reminder of what the passengers went through and what we were all doing that day," recalled Nancy McCormick.



"To actually see the visuals and to hear the voices of the passengers were something to remember," added Grace Szubski. "I didn't expect that much of a display. If anyone can, they really should visit."

A buffet lunch followed at the Oakhurst Grille in Somerset, PA. Made famous during America's Prohibition Era, the Oakhurst was a popular destination among the time's businessmen who enjoyed "tea" with their meals. For the classmates, the setting triggered fond memories of fun times in Fred Schuld's American History class.

The final stop was Fallingwater, one of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright's most widely acclaimed works. Designed in 1935 for Pittsburgh department store owner Edgar J. Kaufmann Sr., the home is renowned for its integration of architecture and nature. Built over a waterfall, the home's furnishings (also designed by Wright), family photos, and artwork remain largely intact. Despite corner windows that bring the outdoors inside, classmates enjoyed reliving their initial visit to the estate by touring the grounds, navigating meandering hallways paved with rocks and taking a long walk through the woods in a light rain.

"It was such fun to see Fallingwater again and to appreciate it in a new way," remarked one of the classmates. "I loved it. I had a great time!"

#### Volume II: Movies the Old Fashioned Way

In the late 1940s and 50s, before the old Willow Theater and the Cloverleaf Drive-In Theater were built, the only movie theaters close to Independence were the Parma Theater, close to the intersection of Ridge and Snow Roads, or the Mapletown Theater in Maple Heights. Somewhat later, there was also the Yorktown Theater on Brookpark Road. They are all long gone now and



but a memory. The more impressive theaters were downtown on Euclid Avenue...The Palace. Loew's Ohio. Loew's Stillman, Loew's State, the Allen, and the Hippodrome. These theaters were built for live theatre, but later were used as movie houses.

Few knew that Independence, in fact, had a facility where you could watch full-length feature films on a big screen in the gymnasium in our old Brecksville Road school. When the gym/ auditorium and cafeteria addition was built, it contained a projection room with two large Arc projection machines. As I recall, you needed a minimum of two machines. Feature films were somewhere between four and six reels long including shorts and a cartoon. As you were loading and playing reel one on projector one, you

would be setting up reel two on projector two so that when reel one was done, you would switch to two. While reel two was playing, you would rewind reel one and then set up projector



one with reel three and so on and so on.

When we were in grade school back in the 40s, we were shown full-length feature films in the gym at lunchtime one reel a day. The cost was 2 or 3 cents per reel. In other words, we paid 10 - 15 cents a week to see a full-length feature film. This was like a memory test to remember what took place on the previous reels. These films were generally shown in inclement winter weather months when it was too cold to play outside at lunchtime. Back then, there was no film rating system, but as I recall, they were mostly comedies. We sat on the hard gym floor in small groups to watch the movie. Actually, I think we talked more than we watched.

During the months. summer the school showed feature-length films the gym in on Friday evenings for the residents of Independence. We saw a lot of Bob and Hope Bing Crosby movies and few Esther а Williams films Bathing Beauty (1944) and Neptune's Daughter



(1949). I don't remember the storyline, but I have a vivid memory of Esther looking quite sexy in her light-colored, one-piece bathing suit. Wow! Most of the movies were in black and white in those days.

Members of the school's Projection Club ran the equipment that showed the movies. Sometimes there were unscheduled technical breaks (e.g. the film would break and had to be spliced together or the Arc light burned a hole in the film and it had to be cut out and then spliced together). Those were the days before technology changed the motion picture industry forever, and it all happened in our old, beloved Brecksville Road School.
